The core concept of "One Health" mainly emphasizes the correlation between humans, animals and environmental health, attaches importance to the role of the environment in the spread of diseases, and aims to achieve overall health for humans, animals and the environment.

Presently, there are many successful practices of One Health approach available around the world. On October 17th, 2022, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the World Health Organization (WHO), and the World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH, formerly known as OIE) jointly launched the "One Health" joint action plan, namely "One Health Joint Plan of Action 2022-2026" which aims at creating an integrated framework of systems and capacities to strengthen cooperation among all parties in preventing, predicting, detecting, and responding to health threats.

The One Health Bulletin (OHB) was officially launched on November 3, 2021, One Health Day, and is the first journal in the field of One Health in China and indexed by CABI and EBSCO. As a part of Hainan One Health Program sponsored by the World Bank Group, OHB focuses on theoretical and policy research in areas such as new infectious diseases, antibiotic resistance, food safety, and environmental health, aiming to provide an academic platform for scholars and practitioners in the global arena of One Health to communicate and exchange ideas. OHB also seeks to share China's experience of One Health approach rapidly and efficiently with the rest of the world, and presents a window showcasing the uniquely Chinese perspective on global human health, animal health, and environmental health.

In response to the "One Health Joint Plan of Action 2022-2026" and to further promote the highlights of the field, encourage academic exchanges and discussions, and introduce Chinese wisdom and Hainan Free Trade Port demonstration experience, OHB is planning to publish four special issues on the themes of emerging and re-emerging zoonotic diseases, food safety risks, antibiotic resistance, and environmental health. We are now cordially inviting our editorial board members or other relevant experts in the field to serve as our guest editors.

Guest Editor Responsibilities:

- Determine the theme of the special issue
- Invite 1-2 experts in the field to serve as co-guest editors to solicit contributions and organize the special issue
- Recommend potential authors and invite scholars to submit manuscripts
- Oversee the peer review process
